OPINION AND ORDER

This case comes on for review by the Full
Commission on appeal by claimant from an opinion filed
herein by an Administrative Law Judge on March 28, 2003.

The Administrative Law Judge entered the following
findings of fact and conclusions of law:

1. The Arkansas Workers' Compensation Commission has jurisdiction of this claim.
2. On July 19, 1990, the relationship of employee-employer-carrier existed among the parties.

3. On July 19, 1990, the claimant warned (sic) wages sufficient to entitle him to weekly compensation benefits of \$226.11/\$169.59 for TTD/PPD benefits.
4. On July 19, 1990, the claimant sustained an injury arising out of and in the course of his employment.
5. Respondents last paid indemnity benefits to the claimant relative to the July 19, 1990 compensable injury on June 28, 1991, and last paid medical benefits on August 27, 1991.
6. On or about July 15, 2002, claimant filed a claim for additional benefits relative to the July 19, 1990 compensable injury.
7. The present claim for additional workers' compensation benefits is barred pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 11-9-702(b)(1).

In this case, we have reviewed the record de novo, weighing the evidence impartially and without giving the benefit of the doubt to either party. Ark. Code Ann. § 11-9-704(c) and Fowler v. McHenry, 22 Ark. App. 196, 737 S.W.2d 663 (1987). It is our opinion that the decision of the Administrative Law Judge is correct and should be affirmed. Specifically, we find from a preponderance of the evidence that the findings of fact made by the Administrative Law

Judge are correct, and they are, therefore, adopted by the Full Commission. Accordingly, we affirm and adopt the decision of the Administrative Law Judge filed March 28, 2003, and this claim is denied and dismissed.
