Decision of the Administrative Law Judge: Reversed.

ORDER

The Court of Appeals has reversed the Commission's decision in the above-styled matter and has remanded "for an award of ten percent permanent-partial impairment to Dillard's right-upper extremity." See, Dillard v. Benton County Sheriff's Office, No. CA 04-025 (Ark. App. 9-22-04). Therefore, the Full Commission reverses the administrative law judge's finding that the statute of limitations bars the instant claim. We find that the claimant proved he was entitled to a 10% anatomical impairment rating for his right upper extremity. The claimant's attorney is entitled to a

fee for legal services pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §11-9-715(a) (Repl. 1996). For prevailing on appeal to the Full Commission, the claimant's attorney is entitled to an additional fee of two-hundred fifty dollars (\$250), pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §11-9-715(b) (2) (Repl. 1996).
