## OPINION AND ORDER

Claimant appeals an opinion and order of the  
Administrative Law Judge filed March 29, 2005. In said  
order, the Administrative Law Judge made the following  
findings of fact and conclusions of law:

1. The stipulations agreed to by the parties at the pre-hearing conference conducted on January 5, 2005, and contained in a pre-hearing order filed that same date, are hereby accepted as fact.

2. Claimant has failed to prove by a preponderance of the evidence that he suffered a compensable injury to his left knee while working for the respondent employer.

We have carefully conducted a de novo review of the entire record herein and it is our opinion that the Administrative Law Judge's decision is supported by a preponderance of the credible evidence, correctly applies the law, and should be affirmed. Specifically, we find from a preponderance of the evidence that the findings of fact made by the Administrative Law Judge are correct and they are, therefore, adopted by the Full Commission.

Therefore we affirm and adopt the March 29, 2005 decision of the Administrative Law Judge, including all findings and conclusions therein, as the decision of the Full Commission on appeal.
