## OPINION AND ORDER

The Arkansas Court of Appeals has affirmed the Commission's finding that treatment for the claimant's pulmonary embolism was compensable. However, the Court has reversed and remanded for specific findings to

support the Commission's determination of permanent and total disability. American Eagle Airlines v. Berndt, CA11-1035 (March 28, 2012).

The Full Commission therefore remands this matter to the administrative law judge, and we direct the administrative law judge to enter findings of fact and conclusions of law utilizing the correct standard for permanent and total disability, as mandated by the Court of Appeals.
